Past Use


The site was once used as a metal-working factory with a separate machine shop structure in operation from late 1800s-1970.

Suspected Environmental Concerns

At least one 10,000 gallon fuel oil tank was located on the site between the 1940s and 1970s and is associated with known petroleum contamination. The site is potentially contaminated with heavy metals, cutting oils, other petroleum and solvents.

Potential Reuse/Redevelopment

Site combined with the Wadsworth & Son Scythe Factory site has been designated as potentially serving as the "Wadsworth Park Node" which would be the northern terminus of the proposed Greenway. The node would be designed as a rural park with a play area, picnic tables, pedestrian riverfront access and connections to historic river uses.


Former metal-working factory in operation until the mid 1900s with historic coal and coke usage and oil storage. The remaining structure is condemned. It was once used as a grist mill.

Current Use and Exisitng Conditions

Large site bounded by West Street, Washington Street, the Owasco River and Venice Street. Site is primarily vacant with utility building located near the intersection of West and Washington Streets. Residential properties located north of West Street with direct views of the site. A flood mitigation study was completed for this site.

Past Use

Site was first used for a carpet factory then retooled for use as a shoe factory, referred to as the Dunn & McCarthy Shoe Factory. Site was also used as a hame factory and a vinegar company. Site is located within the neighborhood referred to as the Dunn & McCarthy Neighborhood. It is also adjacent to the Owasco River and within a floodplain.

Suspected Environmental Concerns

This site is likely contaminated with chromium, other metals and solvents.

Potential Reuse/Redevelopment

Designated as a Riverfront Development Node in City's Comprehensive Plan. Potential for mixed use development with connection to the Owasco River Greenway.

Auburn Woolen Co., H.N. Lemon and Co., Fay and Bowen Bicycle Spokes and Nipples Factory

Acreage: Part of an 11.7 acre site

Zoning: R-2 Single, two & multi-family residential

Current Use and Existing Conditions

This site is currently vacant and wooded. The Owasco River extends through the site creating beautiful views. The sides of the property along the River are steep slopes making it difficult for its redevelopment. It addition, the site is located within a floodplain.

Past Use

A portion of the site was used as a factory manufacturing wool products until the mid 1900's. A manufactured gas plant was located on the site until the late 1800's and a tin and paint shop related to the mill remained after the mill was demolished and was converted to a garage for the City of Auburn Sanitation Department until it too, was demolished. Another portion of the site was used for a glove and mitten factory and shoe factory with operations including leather tanning and glove making. The factory was demolished in the 1900's. In addition, another portion of the site was used also as a shoe factory which was converted to cutting, finishing and fitting bicycle tires, spokes and nipples.

Suspected Environmental Concerns

Heavily contaminated with coal tar, heavy metals and solvents.

Potential Reuse/Redevelopment

The site has been designated as a "Riverfront Trail Node" within the Greenway as proposed in the City's Comprehensive Plan. The trail would extend from downtown to the Lake Ave. Bridge.
