Community Development Block Grants addressed the following 2022 program year annual goals and objectives identified in the Five Year

Strategic Consolidated Plan and the 2022 Annual Action Plan.

Goal 1: Public Services: Human Service agencies assisted 1,050 low to moderate income individuals in the City of Auburn. Human Service Agencies and programs include: Aurora of CNY- Seniors with Hearing and Vision Loss; Boyle Senior Center- Senior Programming; Booker T. Washington- Summer Youth Program; Cayuga County BOCES Health Train program, Cayuga Counseling- Counseling for youth; Legal Aid- Legal representation for victims of domestic violence; Transportation Project- transportation for seniors and the disabled. CDBG funds: \$116,560.29

Homelessness Prevention- CDBG funding supports homeless services through human service agency funding. The following agencies and programs have assisted 88 individuals in homeless prevention this program year. Cayuga Seneca Community Action Agency- Homeless prevention and Intervention; Catholic Charities- Rental Assistance, Chapel House- Case Management Services for individuals staying at the Emergency Homeless Shelter. CDBG funding: \$30,738

Goal 2: Public Infrastructure- Sidewalk and curb replacement took place in Census Tract 413 and assisted more than 1,220 persons. Sidewalk replacement included Case Av and Chase St. CDBG sidewalk funds: \$308,530.79

Street Tree Planting- Street trees were planted in eligble block group 414-1. CDBG: \$52,059.75

Goal 3: Public Facilities- State Street Public Plaza completed construction and officially opened on August 22, 2022. The final design and for Casey Park Skate Park Project was completed in the fall of 2022 and construction documents for the skate park were finallazed for an open competitive bid, which was released in Feb 2023. CDBG funds: \$87,500.09

Goal 4: Business Lending- Cayuga Economic Development Agency (CEDA) administers the CDBG Small Business Assistance program and Microenterprise program. CDBG supported 1 small business, Combgrown, LLC. \$48,875.06 and 3 microenterprise bussinesses: \$15,000.00

Goal 6: Direct Finacial Assistance Homebuyers- although the chart above reflect 0, the City of Auburn did have 3 financial assistance to

homebuyers projects in program year 2022. The city is working with subreceipient, Homsite, in the reporting of these programs.

Goal 8: Clearance- The City of Auburn completed hazardous material surveys for eligible demolition projects, 107-109 Wall St, 103 Seymour St., and 193 Perrine Ave were a health and safety concern for city residents. CDBG funds: \$5,400.00

Goal 9: Special Development- No Special Development projects took place in 2022.

Goal 10: Administration: This activity reimburses City staff time that is directly spent on CDBG activities, including CDBG administration, oversight, and CoC activities including Homless Task Force. This activity also reimburses Catalyst Cayuga for the Coordination and training of Human Services activities, CNY Fair Housing for Fair Housing Education and outreach, and Cayuga Community Health Network for conducting a landlord training. CDBG Funds: \$148,214.81

In addition, the City of Auburn received CoC funding for trasitional, rapid rehousing, and permenant supportive housing The Housing and Homeless Coalition Continuum of Care programs assisted over 581 in emergency shelter, 126 permanent supportive housing programs, more than 52 persons in Rapid Rehousing programs, and 88 in Transitional Housing. CoC funding: \$530,469.00

### Table 5:

The number of homeless households provided affordable housing units is through the continuum of care NY-505 permenant supportive housing programs. These numbers have fluctuated since Corona Virus funding is no longer available.

The number of non-homeless households provided affordable housing units is based on the number of Fincial Assistance to Hombuyers program. Although three projects were completed in program year 2022, information is continued to be collected for reporting in IDIS.

### Table 6:

The number of households supported through rental assistance: is based on CDBG funded rental assistance programs operated by Community Action Programs and Catholic Charities. The difference between the set one year goal number and the actual number of housholds assited is due to the increase of rent and the amount of assistance a household needs to remain in safe permenant housing.

Production of new units: The City of Auburn has not had a production of new housing units during program year 2022. However, just outside of the City of Auburn, Sennett Meadows apartments, on Genesse Streert Road in the town of Sennett, opened its doors in 2022. The development contains 56 one-bedroom apartments and 4 two-bedroom units. The apartments are designed to be affordable for those 55 and older with incomes at or below 60 percent of the Area Median Income. There are 18 apartments reserved for seniors and veterans with physical disabilities who will have access to rental subsidies and services funded through the Empire State Supportive Housing Initiative. Although this development is located outside of the City, it does serve households that were previously homeless or facing homelessness in the City of Auburn. (Numbers are not reflected in the chart above)

Number of households supported through rehab of exsisting units: 9 Home Repir properties were completed with CDBG funds and were recorded in the above chart.

### Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

The City of Auburn works closely with the NY-505 CNY- Housing and Homeless Coalition CoC and serves on the Executive Committee and the Performance Evaluation Committee, which reviews HUD CoC funded projects in the Onondaga, Oswego and Cayuga County region. The review and evaluation of CoC funded programs, as well as data from HMIS, is essential in the development of the CDBG Annual Action Plan and prioritizing programs and projects for CDBG funding. The amount of funding available and the type of CoC projects that are funded directly impacts the number of housing programs in our community.

Currently, the City of Auburn is seeing a need for emergency housing as well as permenant supportive housing units, which will impact future action plans.

### **Narrative Information**

The Community Development Block Grant Program provides funding to 12 subreceipients to deliver programing to low to moderate income individuals in the City of Auburn. Subrecipient Agencies are successful in connecting individuals and families to a multitude of resources. During the 2022 program year, public service agencies provided services to 565 extremely low income; 395 Low income and 93 moderate income individuals. Totaling in 1,053 low to moderate income individuals in the City of Auburn.

Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

The City of Auburn, located in Cayuga County are both part of the Housing and Homeless Coalition of Central New Yore (HHC), which serves as the Continuum of Care (CoC), designated by HUD as NY-505 CoC. HHC brings together Onondaga, Cayuga and Oswego counties to assess the needs of our communities and develop comprehensive, effective and coordinated strategies to reduce, prevent and ultimately end homelessness. The coordinated entry assessment system assists with the coordination of service delivery across the tri-county geographic region. The Coordinated Entry (CE) process helps to ensure that our most vulnerable households are more quickly and efficiently referred and connected to housing and assistance.

During the 2022 program year the CoC reported:

Total number of people served in emergency shelters:

Number of Veterans: 34

Number of Chronically Homeless: 41

Number of Adult Only Households (single or couples): 390

Number of Families: 58 (187 people in those families)

Number of Youth under 25: 57

Number of Parenting youth under 25: 7

Number fleeing DV: 34 (these do not include the DV shelter numbers)

In 2021, The City of Auburn received CDBG-CV3 funding and assisted Cayuga Community Health Network for a Street Outreach Coordinator Position. This position is the first street outreach position in the City of Auburn and Cayuga County that works directly with homeless individuals that are eith at risk of becoming homeless, are homeless and living on the street and/or are exiting the correctional facility. The Street Outreach Coordinator works with local agencies to help meet household's basic needs and/or assist with resolving emergency situations. During the 2022 program year 54 individuals, includinging 10 families were assisted. Funding to support this position is through the City of Auburn CDBG-CV3, Cayuga County Department of Social Services and United Way of Cayuga County.

The street outreach and advocacy position is part of the HHC Street Outreach workgroup which meets regularly to address the needs of unsheltered individuals and discusses any concerns our communities may have regarding street homelessness and outreach activities.

The City of Auburn and Cayuga County are also part of the Finger Lakes 211 region. Finger Lakes 211 is a helpline that is available 24/7 to individuals and organizations that focuses on connecting people to the right local resources. Resources include but are not limited to food and meals, mental health, suicide prevention, housing, health services and transportation. In addition, local non-profit agencies work collaboratively with the Department of Social Services, and other service organizations, such as food pantries and soup kitchens, to distribute information about the available services for households experiencing or at-risk of homelessness in our community. This includes published materials on accessing housing, supportive services and health care. The information is distributed in public areas, on social media, through local networking meetings and by word of mouth.

### Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

The Cayuga County Department of Social Services (DSS) is the main point of access for those experiencing homelessness and homeless vulnerable households that present for services. DSS is centrally located in downtown Auburn ( 160 Genesee Street) and has made several changes to its facilities and procedures to decrease wait times and lower barriers to services. DSS hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM. They have a 24-hour (after hours and weekends) emergency telephone number for households that are homeless. If those experiencing homelessness, go to DSS and are eligible for emergency shelter, they will be placed at Chapel House (single men's shelter or Transitional Units), Rescuse Mission (Transitional units), Community Action Program's Domestic Violence shelter or Rapid Rehousing Program or in hotels/motels. DSS has made a tremendous financial and organizational commitment to meeting the emergency and transitional housing needs of homeless households. The City of Auburn works closely with DSS staff, Homeless and Hosing Coalition staff as well as local homeless providers to help address community housing needs.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

Homeless prevention, Cayuga County DSS has a rental arrears program that prevents evictions for eligible individuals and families on a case by case basis through Emergency Assistance Applications. The City of Auburn CDBG funding for the 2022 PY supported Community Action Agency and Catholic Charities for a rental arreas program for eligible City of Auburn residents.

For children being discharged to independent living, the social services district must assess whether this

is in the best interest of the child. Furthermore, no child may be discharged to independent living, unless the child has a residence other than a shelter for adults, shelter for families, SRO hotel or any other congregate living arrangement which houses more than 10 unrelated persons and there is a reasonable expectation that the residence will remain available to the child for at least the first 12 months after discharge. Family Reunification Housing Choice Vouchers are also utilized through Homsite where appropriate.

NYS Department of Corrections has mandated that to be paroled from prison, inmates must have a plan in place that includes stable housing and employment. Auburn Correctional Facility's Transitional Services Unit prepares an initial discharge plan for each inmate. Prior to being paroled, an inmate is referred back to the county of commitment and/or last known address for residence. The Cayuga County Street Outreach and Advocacy position works closely with Cayuga County Correctional Facility in the discharge plan and assists in connecting individuals with services.

Auburn Community Hospital has case mangers responsible for discharge planning that ensure persons treated on the behavioral health unit or the emergency room have appropriate housing prior to discharge. During PY 2022, Cayuga County Mental Health implemented a daytime mobile crisis intervention and contracts with Liberty Resources to provide mobile crisis during evening hours. The benefit of a mobile crisis intervention is that most individuals can be stabilized in the community, diverted from unnecessary hospital presentations, and receive a direct linkage to recommended services in the community.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

Cayuga County and the City of Auburn have programs available to assist homeless persons to make the transition to permanent housing and independent living.

The Cayuga Community Health Network Street outreach and advocacy position facilitates access to services, including housing, for homeless individuals, families, and those who are at risk of being homeless. The street outreach position provides assistance and stays connected to individuals who are homeless. The position not only provides care packages and wellness checks on a regular but also works with them to obtain services such as food from a mobile food pantry, transportation, a government ID, medical care, cash assistance, section 8 vouchers, obtain housing, and employment. This position works closely with a number of different local housing, employment and human service agencies.

The VA in coordination with HUD provides 10 to 20 permanent housing VASH vouchers to chronically homeless veterans and their families to help end veteran homelessness. The vouchers are managed by

the Auburn Housing Authority in the City of Auburn and by Homsite in the rest of Cayuga County.

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program provided by Soldier On, assists veterans and their families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless by providing in-home case management, referral services, and temporary financial assistance for veterans.

Chapel House has an emergency shelter with 19 beds for homeless men, along with emergency housing with 16 beds for men and women. The City's CDBG program supports a case manager at the shelter to assist individuals with increasing access to resources, increase income, and securing housing.

Community Action Program has a 9 bed Domestic Violence (DV) shelter to serve persons fleeing domestic violence. The shelters have designated staff to work with homeless households to obtain permanent housing. Additionally, clients have access to legal representation through Legal Aid of CNY. The program, which assists victims of domestic violence obtain divorces, orders of protection, and child custody, is funded through the City's CDBG program.

Cayuga County Department of Social Services contracts with local homeless providers for emergency, transitional and rapid re-housing services and provides for a Homeless Coordinator. Follow up case management services help households remain in permanent housing after placement.

Housing vulnerable and homeless households are strongly encouraged and aided by supportive service workers with applying for HUD Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers at Auburn Housing Authority and Cayuga County Homsite Corporation. Our community has approximately 966 rental assistance vouchers.

The Auburn Housing Authority (AHA) has been a leader in our community in reducing housing barriers to affordable housing especially households with poor credit and rental histories and/or criminal histories. AHA has a total of 326 low income/affordable rental units. The units are in three complexes; 188 apartments at Melone Village, 88 apartments at Brogan Manor and 50 apartments at Olympia Terrace.

The Auburn Housing Development Corporation partners with Auburn Rescue Mission in providing services to 20 permanent supportive housing units and 8 transitional housing units. Merriman Circle provides onsite supportive services (including employment services, life skill classes, DV services, case management services and youth programming).

The Housing and Homeless Coalition NY-505 programs assisted over 490 in emergency shelter, 126 permanent supportive housing programs, 32 enrolled in Rapid Rehousing programs and 74 housed, and 88 in Transitional Housing.

### CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

### Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The Housing Authority applied in the Summer of 2020 for funding through the New York State Unified Funding Round and was successful in obtaining the funds needed to complete the redevelopment of the final remaining 62 units at Melone Village. There are 188 units at Melone Village. Renovations will be similar to those completed to date on other portions of the property and will include the creation of additional handicapped-accessible and audio/visual-equipped units. This third and final phase of redevelopment will also include the conversion of some three and two-bedroom units to two and one-bedroom units to better meet the community's demand for one-bedroom units at the 50% AMI target. Construction began Spring of 2021 and will continue through July 1, 2023.

The Housing Authority applied in the fall of 2022 for funding through the New York State Unified Funding Round to redevelop its remaining 50 units of Federal public housing at the Olympia Terrace apartment complex. If funded, construction will begin in June 2023 and continue through 2025. The Housing Authority has applied for and received permission to privatize these units through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Rental Assistance Demonstration Program (RAD). The property will remain affordable, as it will receive permanent Section 8 rental assistance that will be administered by the Housing Authority.

In September 2022 the City of Auburn passed Council Resolution #95 of 2022 Supporting the Redevelopment of the Olympia Terrace Apartment Complex and Agreement Resolution #96 of 2022 Authorizing the Execution of a Payment in Lieu of Tax (PILOT) Agreement By and Among the City of Auburn, Olympia Terrace Housing Development Fund Company, Inc. and Olympia Terrace Limited Partnership and Authorizing the Conveyance of the Property (as Defined Herein) by the Auburn Housing Authority. Both resolutions will assist the Housing Authority in the addressing the need to renovate affordable housing units at Olympia Terrace.

# Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

Two of the seven seats on the Auburn Housing Authority's Board are reserved for tenants residing in the Housing Authority's public housing complexes. Tenants are elected every 2 years, and one seat is currently occupied. The Housing Authority is working to find another tenant who is willing to run for the vacant seat. Tenant commissioners play an integral role in policy formulation. Auburn Housing Authority has surveyed tenants regarding needed improvements at both public housing complexes, and the improvements that the Housing Authority plan to make directly reflect the priorities noted in the surveys. While developing the Auburn Housing Authority's Five-Year Plan, tenants are consulted for feedback, comments and/or concerns.

Auburn Housing Authority works closely with Homsite Fund Inc. and Home Headquarters to ensure that

tenants are aware of their homeownership programs. Auburn Housing Authority frequently distributes marketing materials to their tenants and there are current discussions to bring Homsite Fund Inc./Home Headquarters staff on site to promote the homeownership education class and closing cost assistance program.

### Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The Auburn Housing Authority is not designated as troubled.

### CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

The City of Auburn revised the city's municipal zoning code and adopted the code in February 2018. The municipal zoning is continually reviewed by staff.

### Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City's underserved populations include low income residents, elderly, the disabled, homeless and at risk homeless. One of the greatest obstacles to meeting underserved needs is the amount of funding available. To combat this issue, the City of Auburn partners with many agencies to create larger and more sustainable impacts in the community. The City funded fair housing activities to educate residents about their housing rights as well as assist those who are being treated unfairly in the rental housing market during the 2022 program year. In addition, the City funds 12 human service agencies to deliver programming that works with low to moderate income individuals and families. For program year 2022, these programs include emergency food, rental and security deposit assistance to obtain and retain permanent housing, youth counseling, youth programming, legal assistance for victims of domestic violence, assistive hearing and visual aids for seniors, senior programming, transportation for disabled individuals and seniors, and emergency shelter case management.

The City of Auburn chairs the local Homeless Task Force. The Homeless Task Force is comprised of local homeless providers and focuses on coordinating resources to best meet the needs of the City's most vulnerable residents.

### Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City has continued an active role on the Cayuga County Lead Poisoning and Prevention Task Force. Code Enforcement and County Health Department staff continue to work together, especially related to properties where children with elevated lead levels reside.

The City has also continued to have discussions with the Cayuga County Health Department and local housing development agency, Homsite Fund Inc. on the possibility of partnering on the application for a lead grant from HUD. At this time, Cayuga County is preparing to be ready to submit an application in the next round of funding. In the meantime, the City has supported Homsite Fund Inc.'s application to local foundations, the Cayuga Commuity Fund and the Allyn Foundation for a windows and door replacement program to combat lead by replacing high friction surfaces.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

While the City of Auburn is not responsible for directly providing social service programs, the City has a good working relationship with Cayuga County and assists with the social service delivery to Auburn residents. The Cayuga County Department of Social Services is responsible for implementing both the federal and New York State legislation that addresses the anti-poverty programs in this community. The Department of Social Services (DSS) provides a wide variety of services to adults, children, elderly, and families in need. These programs include temporary assistance, food stamps, day care subsidies, home energy assistance, medical assistance, and child support services, among others.

The Community Action Agency of Cayuga County has programs that assist low income families including: Homeless Intervention and Case Management, Rapid Re-Housing Program, Supportive Housing Program for Adults, Closet Free Clothing Program, Warm the Children, Employment Pathways, Employment Support and Solutions, Domestic Violence Intervention Program, Supervised Visitation/Safe Exchange Center, Child Passanger Saftey Program, Early Head Start/Head Start/Universal Pre-K Programs, Emergency Services Program, Food Pantry and Emergency Baby Pantry, Emergency Services and Asssitance, Health Insurance, and the Volunteer Transportation Program.

Cayuga Works Career Center; part of Cayuga County Department of Employment and Training serves the workforce development needs of the Auburn area. It's a One-Stop Career Center designed to meet the needs of employers and job seekers in Cayuga County. Services include: Job Search Assistance, Resource Room Services, On Site Job Recruitment, Counseling, Workshops, Computer Resources, Career Development Library, Labor Marker Information, Business Service Team, Worker Tax Credit Information, Vocational Training, On the Job Training for employers and job seekers, Youth Employment and Training Programs. Cayuga Works partners with organizations that provide job training, placement, and retention services in order to better coordinate the delivery of those services in Cayuga County and the City of Auburn. On site partners include: Literacy Volunteers Workforce Development Program. Cayuga County Employment and Training; NYS Department of Labor; Cayuga Community College; and Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES Health Train.

### Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

There are a number of human service organizations in the City of Auburn that serve the many needs of Auburn's underserved population. The agencies range from multi-service providers like Commiunity Action Programs of Cayuga/Seneca and the Rescue Mission to smaller agencies like Calvary Food Pantry. Through City of Auburn agencies and organizations, every effort is being made to address the needs of those in poverty. The City of Auburn, while not a direct provider of human service programming, has assisted many agency programs with CDBG funding. Programs for housing, homeless prevention, health and nutrition, employment, transportation, youth recreation/ education, and numerous others are provided. Our community is fortunate to have several nonprofit resources, but we are beginning to see more opportunities for collaboration on programs. The United Way of Central New York has been at the forefront of assisting the community to prioritize its needs with community funds that are available through their campaign and fundraising. Barriers between agencies continue to be broken down, and partnerships along with the reduction of duplication are making the social service delivery system more

effective in the community.

The City of Auburn is part of the NY-505 Syracuse/Onondaga/Oswego Continuum of Care. The CoC addresses homelessness on a regional basis, shares expertise and resources, builds capacity and improves data collection and reporting. The merger continues to present opportunities toward the goal of addressing the needs of those experiencing homelessness or at-risk of becoming homelessness and ultimately ending homelessness.

# Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Auburn Housing Authority (AHA) is a leader in our community in reducing housing barriers to public housing especially households with poor credit, rental histories and/or criminal histories. AHA allows housing applicants working with partner human services agencies (such as Chapel House, Community Action Programs of Cayuga/Seneca, Rescue Mission, County Mental Health, and Unity House of Cayuga County) to submit a supporting agency affidavit on behalf of the applicant which verifies a household's positive progress in addressing prior issues that in many times allows for approval for housing. AHA provides safe affordable housing and all apartment complexes include utilities. AHA has 188 units at Melone Village, 88 units at Brogan Manor and 50 units at Olympia Terrace. AHA coordinates with DSS and local human service agencies to help low income and housing vulnerable households apply for the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program when its list opens.

Cayuga County does not have an emergency shelter for homeless families or homeless women. Households are emergency hoteled by Cayuga County Department of Social Services (DSS). The Auburn Rescue Mission Family Transitions program was created in partnership with the Auburn Housing Authority and DSS and has 8 transitional units and 20 permenant supportive housing units. Hundreds of households have had their episode of homelessness ended through this partnership. However, there is still a need for more safe and affordable housing with necessary supports for families, in our community.

The Single Point of Access (SPOA) workgroup meets monthly. The SPOA program helps connect individuals who are diagnosed with a mental illness to services in the community. A referral form must be completed in order to be considered for the service. Services that are available through SPOA consists of mental health providers, housing and human service providers, and representatives from DSS. The group reviews hard to serve individuals with several mental illness and other challenges, and develops service and housing plans to address their individual needs.

As a result of Covid-19, the City of Auburn and Cayuga County partnered funding for a street outreach position. This position has been effective over the past year in connecting over 56 individuals including 10 families facing homelessness with resources and securing permenant housing.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

The impediments found in the 2019 Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing (AI) are:

- Disparities in Access to Opportunity due to the contributing factors of access to low poverty areas, access to labor market engagement, and labor market engagement
- Disproportionate Housing Need due to the contributing factors of insufficient affordable housing in a range of unit sizes and black households have disproportionate rates of housing problems
- Publically Supported Housing due to the contributing factors of public housing units having lower levels of access to opportunity
- Disability and Access due to the contributing factors of insufficient, accessible, affordable housing
- Fair Housing Education due to the insufficient fair housing education, insufficient understanding of credit, insufficient fair housing infrastructure, and discriminatory

A Renter's Rights Workshop and a Landlord Resource Workshop is held annually since 2016 and has attracted more than 65 Human Service employees who work with clients that are tenants, 50 tenants and 100 landlords. The main objective of the workshop has been to provide information about affordable suitable decent housing to Auburn residents and create communication and access to programs for human service agencies and landlords. In PY2022 the workshop was reformatted to better educate and inform landlords in the City of Auburn. The training was held on March 25, 2022 and included the following topics: Fire Saftey, Fair Housing, Lead, and Hoarding.

In addition, The City of Auburn funded CNY Fair Housing with CDBG funds for Fair Housing outreach and education. This program provides Fair housing outreach in our community. CNY Fair housing provides comprehensive fair housing services in the City of Auburn including complaint intake, undercover testing and investigation, fair housing counseling, and advocacy and representation to victims of discrimination. Both of these programs together help address the impediments listed in the 2019 City of Auburn Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing (AI).

On a monthly basis, desk audits of the Human Service agency sub recipients are conducted to review program expenditures and program accomplishments. Additionally, on-site monitoring visits of Human Services sub recipients are conducted annually to review programs and documentation. During the annual site visit a monitoring sheet is completed and put in the file.

Monitoring of housing projects is attempted to be completed annually via a letter sent to program participants including owner-occupants and renters asking to verify continued residency in the assisted unit. Monitoring

The City's CDBG Small Business Assistance Program loan portfolio is monitored annually through site visits. Annual site visits include inspection of collateral, documentation of job commitments, review of company financials and face-to-face discussion of business issues, needs and plans for future growth and/or stability. The City currently is in contract with CEDA for the Small Business Assistance Program including monitoring. They have successfully monitored several businesses and continue to monitor the business to complete their contract.

With respect to monitoring of human service and housing programs, there were no major issues identified. Monitoring provides an opportunity to for City staff to answer sub recipient questions and address, as needed, any issues or confusion with HUD regulations, compliance and/or completing monthly fiscal and program reports throughout the year.

### Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)

The 15-day comment period for the CAPER, began on Tuesday, June 13, 2023 and ended on Wednesday, June 28, 2023. The notice, a copy is included, was published in *The Citizen* on Tuesday, June 13, 2023. *The Citizen* is the newspaper of general circulation in the City of Auburn. A public hearing regarding the CAPER was held on Monday, June 26, 2023 at 1:00pm in City Hall Council Chambers.

The following comments were received: None

The City recognizes that public input is a critical part of the CDBG Program. Staff is available to discuss the program informally with interested parties throughout the program year. The Citizen Participation Plan, the 5-year Consolidated Planning Strategy and Annual Action Plan and the CAPER are available in the Office of Planning and Economic Development for review. Additionally, these documents are available on the City of Auburn's Office of Planning and Economic Development website: http://www.auburnny.gov/Public\_Documents/AuburnNY\_Planning/CDBG.

Annually, the City of Auburn holds three Public Hearings regarding the CDBG Program. One is held in November during our public outreach for the preparation of the Annual Action Plan. The other public hearing is held at a City Council meeting in January or February, prior to the submission of the Annual Action Plan. A public hearing is also held in June regarding the CAPER. In addition to the public meeting and hearings, the City distributed a CDBG survey to further collect information and comments for the development of the Action Plan. Survey results and comments are presented in the Five Year Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan.

The primary sources of comments on the City's CDBG program were presented during the public meeting and public hearings for the development of 2022-2023 Annual Action Plan. The plans were submitted to HUD Buffalo and is available for the public to view in the Office of Planning and Economic Development and on the City's website. It should be noted that the comments received revolved around a wide array of community issues, not just concerns that can be addressed with CDBG funds; they were shared as part of the public input process and used to establish priorities or continue with established priorities for the Action Plan.
