

City Manager Douglas A. Selby Biography

Doug Selby was appointed to the position of Auburn City Manager in August 2011. In this position he functions as the Chief Executive Officer for the City, leading the staff and overseeing the daily functions of city government under the policy guidance of the Mayor and City Council.

Mr. Selby's career in local government organizations began with his work as an engineering manager for the development of water and wastewater systems for Las Vegas, Nevada, which at the time was among the fastest growing cities in the United States. His most significant engineering achievement was as Engineering Director for the Southern Nevada Water Authority where he led the planning, design and construction of a new drinking water system to meet the demands of exploding growth in Southern Nevada. The massive new water system was designed to deliver over 600 million gallons per day of water from Lake Mead and cost over \$2 billion to build.

He later joined the city of Las Vegas, Nevada as a Deputy City Manager and subsequently City Manager where he worked with the Las Vegas City Council managing an annual operating and capital budget of over \$1 billion with a staff of over 3000 employees serving 600,000 residents in a 135 square mile area. During his time with the city he established initiatives in sustainability, diversity and performance management that continue today. As the Executive Director of the Las Vegas Redevelopment Agency he worked with the City Council on the revitalization of downtown, which witnessed over a billion dollars of retail, entertainment, medical, resort and housing developments.

Mr. Selby has bachelor and master of science degrees and a doctorate in engineering. He is a graduate of the Senior Executives in Government program at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, is a credentialed city manager by the International City Manager's Association and is a licensed professional engineer (inactive).
