The Detective Bureau was assigned 27 new cases and closed 16 previously assigned cases. 2 juveniles were petitioned to Cayuga County Family Court. Detectives made 2 arrests for a total of 3 charges. There were 2 felonies and 1 misdemeanor.

The Identification Bureau was assigned 77 new cases and a total of 177 items were received as evidence/property. Officers processed 56 photo memory cards, 1 background check and issued new/renewed 2 taxi licenses. Officers oversaw the state mandated reporting of 123 sex offenders residing in the City of Auburn which included 87 sex offender contacts. Officers also processed 4 items of evidence within the Identification Bureau and sent 7 other items out to the crime lab for further processing.

The School Resource Officer program handled 124 incidents in and around school buildings which required intervention by school officers. The incidents included criminal cases, fighting, bullying and other disruptive behavior. There was 1 arrest made concerning school related incidents which included 1 adult. The SRO supervisor participated in a Thanksgiving dinner distribution sponsored by the Auburn Teachers Association and Majorpalooza. The supervisor and the SROs collected, packed and delivered Thanksgiving dinners to over one hundred families in need in the Auburn Enlarged City School District.

The City Jail temporarily housed 1 person awaiting arraignment in Auburn City Court on various charges.

The Traffic Division coordinated DWI patrols on weekends during the month of November to curb drinking and driving. During those details APD officers issued 11 traffic tickets and made 2 DWI arrests. The additional patrols are part of a program funded by the Cayuga County Stop DWI Committee.

The Training and Planning Division coordinated "Implicit Bias" training for members of the department during the month of November. The training was presented by Dr. Bryant Marks and held at Syracuse University. During the presentation Marks defined different types of biases, explained how to recognize bias and provided advice on how to prevent it. All department personnel also received bloodborne pathogen exposure training. During this state mandated training officers are instructed in risks associated with the exposure to communicable diseases.
