With Halloween right around the corner the City of Auburn Police Department would like to offer the following tips to keep kids safe while they are out searching for treats:

- Make sure your costumes fit properly and are flame retardant; add reflective tape if possible to avoid accidents,
- Always use the buddy system or go with a parent but never go alone,
- Carry a cell phone if you are not accompanied by a parent and let your parents know the area you plan to trick or treat in,
- Stay on the sidewalk whenever possible and be aware of vehicle traffic while crossing the road,
- Stay in an area that you are familiar with and do not go to houses that are not well lit,
- Never go into a stranger’s house or get into a stranger’s vehicle,
- Carry a flashlight or a glow stick so you are visible to pedestrian and vehicle traffic,
- Always be respectful of other people and their property,
- Although it may be difficult to do, avoid eating any of your candy until you get home so it can be properly inspected by an adult,
- And finally, if you see anything suspicious while out trick or treating make sure you notify an adult so they can call the police or 911.
