The next meeting of the City of Auburn Planning Board will be held on Tuesday, October 6, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. and will be held at Memorial City Hall, Council Chambers, 24 South Street.

Ceremonial Presentations and Proclamations –

HEREAS, the City of Auburn, NY is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting Auburn; and

WHEREAS, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

WHEREAS, home fires killed more than 2,630 people in the United States in 2017, according to the National Fire Protection Association[®] (NFPA[®]), and fire departments in the United States responded to 357,000 home fires; and

WHEREAS, cooking is the leading cause of home fires in the United States where fire departments responded to more than 173,200 annually between 2013 and 2017; and

WHEREAS, two of every five home fires start in the kitchen with 31% of these fires resulting from unattended cooking; and

WHEREAS, more than half of reported non-fatal home cooking fire injuries occurred when the victims tried to fight the fire themselves; and

WHEREAS, children under five face a higher risk of non-fire burns associated with cooking than being burned in a cooking fire

WHEREAS, Auburn's residents should stay in the kitchen when frying food on the stovetop, keep a three-foot kid-free zone around cooking areas and keep anything that can catch fire away from stove tops; and

WHEREAS, residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive a fire; and

WHEREAS, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half; and

WHEREAS, Auburn's first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and

WHEREAS, Auburn's residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Fire Prevention Week theme TM, *"Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!!"* effectively serves to remind us to stay alert and use caution when cooking to reduce the risk of kitchen fires.

THEREFORE, I, Mayor Michael Quill, of Auburn, do hereby proclaim October 4-10, 2020, as

throughout this City, and I urge all the people of Auburn by checking their kitchens for fire hazards and using safe cooking practices during Fire Prevention Week 2020, and to support the many public safety activities and efforts of Auburn's fire and emergency services.

A. City Manager's Report

• The Civil Service Test for Firefighters is scheduled for Oct. 10. We have 223 candidates signed up for the exam.

• On Saturday Sept. 26, Civil Service administered the Police Officer exam. 125 candidates signed up, 80 sat for the exam locally, and 25 took the test at other locations.

• We urge all residents to complete their 2020 Census by October 5 – the deadline has been extended. The Census can be completed electronically through the webpage 2020census.gov, or following the link on the City of Auburn webpage, or call 1-844-330-2020. Census data is used to determine eligibility and funding for a variety of community programs and projects for the next ten years, and is secure and confidential.

• The State St Bridge project is moving along and on schedule. The main structural steel beams have been set in place.

• Our most recent water samples have shown traces of microcystin in the raw water but none in the finished water.

• Demolition work related to the repair of the parking garage is scheduled to start Monday October 5. Notice has been sent through various channels and signage has been and will be in place to inform users.

• The Auburn Beautification Committee helped clean up along the River Trail last week and city crews will be tackling brush and overgrowth over the next few weeks.

• Next week DPW crews will be working at Technology Park to make way for new signage being design, manufactured and installed by Mack Studios.

LOCAL LAW #1 of 2020

REPEALING AND REPLACING SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 265 OF THE AUBURN CITY CODE ENTITLED "TAXATION"

WHEREAS, on March 28, 1991, the Auburn City Council enacted and established Local Law No. 2-1991 as Chapter 181, entitled "Taxation," which is now known as Chapter 265 of the City Code, pursuant to New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10(1); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 265, Articles II and X, of the City Code authorize the City of Auburn to provide exemptions to low income senior citizens and persons with disabilities by use of a sliding income scale; and

WHEREAS, the current Income Sliding Scale has not been updated since 2006/2007 and the City is looking to adopt a new Sliding Income Scale based on the current scale used by New York State; and

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 1 of 2020, attached hereto and incorporated herein, proposes to update Articles II and X of Chapter 265 of the City Code to achieve such uniformity; and

WHEREAS, the passage of Local Law No. 1 of 2020, is categorized as a Type II Action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and New York State Code, Rules, and Regulations Sections 617.5(c)(16), and, therefore, pursuant to NYCRR Section 617.3(f) a determination under SEQRA is not required; and

WHEREAS, subject to City Council approval, a public hearing will be held on October 8, 2020, concerning the repealing of sections of Local Law No. 2-1991 and the enactment of Local Law No. 1 of 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED that the Auburn City Council does hereby repeal the following sections of Local Law No. 2-1991, which was originally passed as Chapter 181 of the City Code entitled "Taxation:"

- 1. Article II, Sections 265(17);
- 2. Article X Sections 265(45);

and,

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the Auburn City Council does hereby adopt Local Law No. 1 of 2020, attached and incorporated herein, which replaces the following Articles and Sections of Chapter 265 of the Auburn City Code entitled "Taxation":

- 1. Article II, Sections 265(17);
- 2. Article X Sections 265(45);

; and,

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the foregoing repeal and adoption shall take effect immediately upon the filing of a certified copy of the local law with the New York Secretary of State.

LAND SALE RESOLUTION #97 OF 2020

AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF A PORTION OF REAL PROPERTY AT 1 STATE STREET

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn owns a vacant parcel located at 1 State Street (the "Property"), which is also known as the "Kalet's Building;" and

WHEREAS, the Property is situated on the west side of State Street between Genesee and Dill Streets and consists of approximately .17 acres; and

WHEREAS, the City acquired the Property by way of a tax foreclosure in 1994 and, ultimately, funded the demolition of the building in 2011 as a part of a plan to transfer the property to Cayuga County for the development of a performing arts center; and

WHEREAS, when the performing arts center project did not come to fruition, the property title was transferred back to the City in 2015; and

WHEREAS, since that time the City has determined that the Property should be used as a public space and hired Bergmann Associated to design the Property for community use; and

WHEREAS, the City has reached out to the community members at large for input on the design of the Property and reached out to the neighboring property owners so that their thoughts and concerns could be considered; and

WHEREAS, this resolution seeks approval of a proposed Purchase Offer and Sale Contract, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, which would transfer a 15x15 ft. portion of 1 State Street to one of the adjacent property owners, Mr. James Driscoll; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Driscoll owns property at 123-125 Genesee Street, which is immediately south of 1 State Street and is proposing this transfer so that he can have fire prevention access to his building, which would, in turn, enable him access to use the 2nd and 3rd floors of the building; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Driscoll has agreed as follows: (1) to use the 15x15 ft. parcel only for fire access prevention or as a small patio space; (2) to maintain and upkeep the same in perpetuity; (3) to provide all easements requested by the City for its project at 1 State Street; and (4) to pay all title and closing costs in connection with the transaction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Auburn hereby authorizes the sale of a parcel of land, which is a part of 1 State Street, pursuant to a Purchase Officer and Sale Contract, attached hereto, to James Driscoll; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor is authorized to sign any and all documents in order to finalize the closing of this real estate transaction.

WHEREAS, Change Order #1 to the professional services agreement with GHD in the amount of \$67,000 is now required to provide design support services during the construction phase of the Wholesale Sewer Metering Project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn Department of Municipal Utilities recommends the City authorize Change Order #1 to GHD Engineering for design support during construction for the Project in the amount of \$67,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby award Change Order #1 in the amount of \$67,000 to GHD Engineering for design support during project construction and is to be charged to Wholesale Sewer Meter Project capital account (#HG 8120 250 IU), 50% of which shall be reimbursed by the Towns; and
