WHEREAS, on September 1, 2021, the City advertised for competitive bids for the HVAC and Boiler Replacement Project; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 21, 2021, bids for the Project were publically opened and the City received the following for the Project:

WHEREAS, City staff completed a bid analysis and recommend the award of the aforementioned to the qualified low bidder for a total bid award of \$53,000; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Auburn City Council award the following Bid for the Project to Frey & Campbell, Inc., in the amount of \$53,000; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Auburn City Council does hereby approve an award to Frey & Campbell, Inc., for the HVAC and Boiler Replacement Project, for the total amount of \$53,000; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the cost of the bid award is to be charged to the DPW HVAC/Boiler Replacement Capital Account #HA 1640.440.JX and funded through Bond ordinance No.2 of 2019; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Mayor of the City of Auburn is authorized to execute any and all documents in reference to the award of this equipment bid.
