• The City Pool at Casey Park has been undergoing some upgrades to its mechanical system. The project is running slightly behind due to some parts supply issues. The poll is tentatively slated to open on Saturday June 30. We'll keep everyone up to date on the city web page and social media.

• The Parking Garage automation project has just about wrapped up. The kiosk and control arm are now in and functioning. We are keeping the booth staffed for a while longer as we work through the transition and troubleshooting phase.

• The Codes Neighborhood Cleanup Crew will be out and working starting on Monday June 25th. There is already a list of 21 lawns that have received proper notification and will be tackled by this crew.

• I met with Code Enforcement and Corporation Counsel this morning to follow up on 33 properties that we have identified significant problems based upon complaints we receive. We will be sending out updates to Council approximately every two weeks to keep you informed of the ongoing status of these properties.

• Clifford Field – paint for the clubhouse was ordered today and we were recently authorized to spend some residual grant funds to resurface the softball fields.

• Corporation Counsel just finalized contract language for the sale of 277 Grant Ave. – there will be a land sale reso before Council on July 5.

• Earlier this week NYS DEC released its Action Plan for Harmful Algal Blooms in Owasco Lake among many other reports for lakes throughout the state. The report can be viewed by the public through the NYS DEC website or soon on the city of Auburn webpage.

AWARD RESOLUTION #91 OF 2018

AUTHORIZING CHANGE ORDER #1 FOR THE W. GENESEE STREET PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, on January 4, 2018, the Auburn City Council authorized Award Resolution #2 of 2018, awarding the W. Genesee Street Pavement Preservation Project to F. Rizzo Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$4,148,679; and

WHEREAS, change order #1 in the amount of \$474,884.49 is now required to finance the costs of the following additional work items:

- Extension of two course overlay limits on Genesee St. that started from North/South St. to James St. instead of just going to Dill St. as originally planned.
- Replacement of 10 existing drainage structures between Dunning Ave. and Veterans Memorial Highway.
- Drainage system improvements at the intersection of Fort St.
- Storm Manhole and storm sewer pipe installed at the Court St. intersection.
- Increased costs due to the escalation of petroleum prices.
- Additional quantity to the binder and top courses to account for the irregularity in the milled surfaces and maintenance of cross slopes.
- Water service upgrades and infrastructure replacement at 11 additional locations.
- Cost to grind concrete sidewalks to eliminate tripping hazards.
- Additional quantity needed to reset existing brick pavers affected by contract work

; and

WHEREAS, the cost of this Resolution is to be charged to West Genesee St. Pavement Preservation Project Account #HA 5110-440-HN in the amount of \$399,029.41 (which is eligible for 80% Federal, and 15% NYS Marchiselli reimbursement), and to W. Genesee St. Pavement Preservation Project Water Account #HF 8340-440-HN-F in the amount of \$75,855.08 for water betterments (which are ineligible for reimbursement).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby award Change Order #1, in the amount of \$ 474,884.49 to F. Rizzo Construction Inc. for the W. Genesee Street Pavement Preservation Project; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby approve a sale of approximately four (4) acres of land located at 41-55 Washington Street, Auburn, New York, to Live It Fitness & Training, LLC, for the purchase price of \$40,000, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Purchase and Sale Agreement, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the foregoing sale is conditioned upon the City Manager's approval of survey costs from LIFT, where said costs are estimated to be above the amount of \$1,000; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, or other appointed designee, is authorized to sign the Purchase and Sale Agreement setting forth the above-terms for the sale of the Property, together with any and all documents in order to close on the sale and transfer of the Properties.
