LAND SALE RESOLUTION #91 OF 2019

AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF REAL PROPERTY AT CHAPMAN AVENUE TO BOOKER T. WASHINGTON COMMUNITY CENTER OF AUBURN, INC

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn is the owner of real property located at 22-24 and 25 Chapman Avenue, Auburn, New York (the "Property"), which is the location of Booker T. Washington Community Center of Auburn, Inc. (the "BTW Community Center"); and

WHEREAS, the City has leased the Property to the BTW Community Center since on or about February 20, 1987; and

WHEREAS, the City has maintained the Property and made improvements, through the use of the Community Development Grant Block Program, including the installation of fire alarm upgrades, new carpets, a new boiler and heating system, new exterior lighting and doors; and

WHEREAS, BTW Community Center would like to assume ownership of the Property so that it can continue to improve and enhance the Community Center by making more improvements, including replacing the existing roofing system, removing and replacing all of the windows, replacing the gym floor and repairing and repaying the parking lot;

WHEREAS, BTW Community Center has presented a written offer to purchase the Property from the City, in consideration of the value of the improvements, which are estimated as being \$553,000; and

WHEREAS, a sale of the Property would help support the growth and development of the Booker T. Washington Community Center of Auburn, Inc., so that it can continue to be an invaluable resource to Auburn's residents and community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby approve a sale of real property located at 22-24 and 25 Chapman Avenue, Auburn, New York, to Booker T. Washington Community Center of Auburn, Inc., subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Purchase and Sale Agreement, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, or other appointed designee, is authorized to sign the Purchase Offer and Sale Contract together with any and all documents necessary to carry out this resolution.
