## LAND SALE RESOLUTION #107 OF 2021

# AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 296 STATE STREET

**WHEREAS**, on November 5, 2000, the City of Auburn acquired title to 1.5 acres of commercial real property located at 296 State Street (the "Property") through a tax foreclosure; and,

WHEREAS, FEAST Kitchen, LLC ("FEAST"), has proposed a Purchase Offer and Sale Contract (the "Contract"), attached hereto and incorporated herein, which offers to purchase the Property from the City for Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000) together with all of the costs associated with developing and improving this Property with a commercial business facility; and,

WHEREAS, the City has notified the property owners on each side of the Property of this transaction and understands that FEAST is currently working cooperatively with one of the neighbors so that the proposed development is considerate of any outstanding concerns; and,

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the Auburn City Council approve the Contract proposed by FEAST on the following conditions: (1) that the City provide only a Quit Claim Deed to the buyer at closing; (2) that the buyer pay for all title and closing costs; (3) that the development comply and adhere to all Planning Board site plan approvals; and (4) that the deed contain a right of reversion, stating that if the proposed development fails to comply with site plan approvals or fails to be completed within two (2) years, then title to the property shall revert back to the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City of Auburn does hereby approve the Purchase Offer and Sale Contract, attached hereto and incorporated herein, for the sale of real property located at 296 State Street to FEAST Kitchen, LLC, for the price of \$8,000 together with all of the costs of improvements and development of the property, and subject to the following conditions:

(1) That the City provide only a Quit Claim Deed to the buyer at closing;

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- (2) That the buyer be responsible for payment of all title and closing costs;
- (3) That the Property development comply and adhere to all Planning Board site plan approvals; and
- (4) That the Quit Claim deeds include a right of reversion, stating that if the proposed development fails to comply with site plan approvals or fails to be completed within two (2) years, then title to the property shall revert back to the City.
