E. GENESEE STREET - EXTENTS GENESEE ST. BRIDGE TO FULTON STREET

- SEWER FUND
 - 3 Brick Chimney Manholes Replaced with precast concrete structures Complete
 - Install CB's and Storm Laterals to accept future separated roof drains/sewer separation Coordinate with Paving
 - Install new sewer lateral to provide separate sewer service to 11 E. Genesee St Coordinate with Paving
- WATER FUND
 - Install new 6" service to 22 E. Genesee Street Install June 2022
 - Replace substandard water services as required— Complete
 - Install isolation valve to hydrant at Seminary and E. Genesee St. Install June 2022
- TOURING FUNDS
 - Mill and Pave E. Genesee Street from Genesee St. Bridge → Fulton Street
 - Project is under design
 - Line and repair failing galvanized storm pipe Slipline where possible.
 - Bid out work in June of 2022 → Award in July 2022



JOHN STREET – EXTENTS ARTERIAL (EAST BOUND) TO E. GENESEE STREET


- SEWER FUND
 - Install new storm system to separate storm and sanitary along the entire extents of project – Begin as soon as June 2022 – Pending NYSDOT highway work permit
 - Maintenance and Protection of Traffic will be required John St will require occasional closures
- TOURING FUNDS
 - Mill and pave entire extents
 - Replacement of curbing where necessary and installation of new sidewalks
 - Project will be bid and completed as part of E. Genesee Street Paving Works

- 2) (Seth and Mike) LED Conversion Convert all existing downtown decorative poles from Induction Lamps to LED Fixtures. Amount Unknown \$50,000
- 3) (Seth and Mike) Grant Ave Striping from Seymour to the City Line near Walmart (Entire) \$30,000
- 4) (Seth and Mike)Arterial Striping from Seymour to Rte. 326 (Entire) \$30,000
- 5) (Billy) Allen Street/Commerce Way/Tech Park Complete Street Lighting \$100,000
- 6) (Seth) Update Additional Traffic Controllers \$30,000
- 7) (Seth and Billy) State Street Mill and Overlay Begin at State Street Bridge and Work North as funding allows \$500,000
- 8) (Seth) By way of Change Order, add all alternative streets to 2022 or 2023 Road Program \$270,000
- 9) (Seth and Mike) Fence removal project along the arterial.

CITY CLERK

- \$20,000 for restoration and repainting of roadside historical markers along NYS routes (Route 20, Route 34, Route 38)
- \$50,000 for replacement of sidewalks at Seward Park
- \$210,000 for 30 new street light poles to advance the replacement/repainting program on E. Genesee Street (based on Mike Talbot reporting to Council that replacing a street light costs \$7,000.)
