CEREMONIAL PRESENTATIONS –

International Underground Railroad Month Proclamation

WHEREAS, states and entities across the country have embraced and designated the month of September as International Underground Railroad Month because it has been historically documented that it is the month that two of the most well known freedom seekers and Underground Railroad operatives, Harriet Tubman and Frederick Douglass escaped from slavery; and **WHEREAS**, in 1998 the United States Congress, adopted legislation titled, the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Act, creating the Network to Freedom program of the National Park Service, with its mission, "through collaboration with local, state and federal entities, as well as individuals and organizations, to honor, preserve and promote the history of resistance to enslavement through escape and flight commonly known as the Underground Railroad, which continues to inspire people worldwide"; and

WHEREAS, a local research study titled "Uncovering the Freedom Trail in Auburn and Cayuga County" was completed in 2005 and published by the City of Auburn's Historic Resources Review Board and the Cayuga County Historian's Office, documented over 100 sites in Cayuga County linked to the Underground Railroad of which 12 are listed as partner sites of the NPS Underground Network to Freedom program; and

WHEREAS, locally in the year 2022 the City of Auburn has celebrated the legacy of Harriet Tubman the most famous Conductor of the Underground Railroad through the Harriet Tubman Bicentennial celebration; and

WHEREAS, one featured event of the Tubman Bicentennial celebration highlights the story of the City of Auburn's Underground Railroad pioneers, Kate and Harry Freeman, founders of the New Guinea Negro Settlement in Auburn, as told through the homecoming of their descendent, Pastor Ted Freeman, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, through the work of many individuals involved locally at sites and organizations such as the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park, the Seward House Museum, the NYS Equal Rights Heritage Center, the Cayuga County Office of Tourism, Opendore and the Howland Stone Store Museum, among many others, the preservation, promotion and education of the legacy of the Underground Railroad is told daily as a significant part of our history in Auburn and Cayuga County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that I, Michael D. Quill, Mayor of the City of Auburn, New York, on behalf of the members of City Council and citizens of Auburn, do hereby proclaim in the year of Harriet Tubman's Bicentennial Celebration and upon the occasion of the homecoming of Pastor Ted Freeman, Jr. that the month of September 2022 is hereby designated as

Kate and Harry Freeman International Underground Railroad Month

in the City of Auburn and encourage all to attend events, visit sites and learn more about the important role the people and sites of Auburn and Cayuga County in the 1800's played through their courageous participation as part of the Underground Railroad.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the City of Auburn to be affixed this Fifteenth day of September 2022.

Mayor Quill presented the proclamation to Karen Kuhl, Executive Director of the Cayuga County Office of Tourism and she presented to the City Council pamphlets on the Underground Railroad sites in Auburn and Cayuga County.

An update Harriet Tubman Bicentennial was presented by Courtney Kasper, Visitor Experience Manager of the Equal Rights Heritage Center.

An update on the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park was presented by Superintendent Ahna Wilson. She reported that the restoration of the AME Zion Church and parsonage continues on Parker Street. She also stated the National Park Service will begin its foundation document process in October of 2022, the process will include a series of public meetings to solicit input towards its preparation. She also announced that Park Ranger Kimberly Szewczyk, Senior Interpretive Specialist for the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park will be retiring in early 2023 and will be departing her position in Auburn soon. Ranger Kim was the first full time Park Ranger assigned to the Auburn NPS site following its establishment in 2017.

Mayor Quill, on behalf of members of City Council presented Park Ranger Kimberly Szewczyk, Senior Interpretive Specialist for the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park with a Key to the City to thank her for her enthusiastic commitment to helping the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park in Auburn become established in the community over the past 6 years.

Mayor Quill opened the Public Hearing for Restore NY Communities Initiatives Grant Application for 22 E. Genesee Street. Joe Bartalotta, the applicant spoke to discuss the project. He also submitted a petition of E. Genesee Street residents and business owners that support the project. Stephanie DeVito, Executive Director of the Auburn Downtown BID spoke to support the grant application.

Mayor Quill opened the Public Hearing for City of Auburn Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) 2022 Program Year Amendment. No speakers.

Central Intelligence Agency Harriet Tubman Statue Unveiling

Harriet Tubman

"I had reasoned this out in my mind. There was one of two things I had a right to, liberty or death. If I could not have one I would have the other - Harriet Tubman circa 1869

> Harriet Tubman was born Araminta Ross, enslaved in Bucktown on Maryland's Eastern Shore. As a young woman, she escaped to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on her own. Yet, she returned to Maryland repeatedly during the next decade, leading many other enslaved persons from bondage in the South to freedom in the North-becoming one of the most famous conductors on the Underground Railroad.

While working as an operator on the Underground Railroad, Tubman used sophisticated tradecraft to remain covert-from disguises to clandestine communications. To reduce the risk of being caught, she obfuscated her movements by launching her missions in the winter, when the days were shorter. She employed a network of assets and allies-ranging from enslaved sailors to notable abolitionists-who provided safehouses, transportation, and funding for her operations.


During the Civil War, at the request of Massachusetts Governor John Andrew, Tubman traveled to South Carolina to help former enslaved persons learn how to live successfully in freedom. While there, she also served as a nurse and then as an intelligence collector for Union commanders. She organized a small group of former enslaved persons to serve as guides and provide intelligence that helped the Union Army conduct a raid on the Combahee Ferry-the breadbasket of South Carolina. On 2 June 1863, intelligence collected by Harriet Tubman assisted Union forces in infiltrating a Confederate stronghold, destroying supplies, and freeing more than 700 enslaved persons.


After the war, Tubman eventually settled in Auburn, New York, where she made her home and opened a nursing facility for the aged and indigent. Tubman died in Auburn on 10 March 1913 and was buried at Fort Hill Cemetery with military honors. In 2021, she was inducted into the Military Intelligence Hall of Fame.

Harriet Tubman was a scout, nurse, liberator, and philanthropist. She collected valuable intelligence for our country and remains a role model to this day-embodying the ethos that all CIA employees strive to emulate.



Harriet Tubman Statue:

The Harriet Tubman statue is a replica of a statue installed at the New York State Equal Rights Heritage Center in Auburn, New York, in 2018. Sculpted by Brian Hanlon, the statue shows Harriet Tubman extending her left hand behind her as if signaling to an invisible group to follow closely on the arduous route. In her right hand, she holds the ring of a lantern, illuminating the pathway to freedom. Dedicated on 7 September 2022, the statue now stands at CIA Headquarters as a tribute to the amazing woman who embodied the Agency's ethos: Service, Integrity, Excellence, Teamwork, Courage, and Stewardship.



RE: CDBG Program Year 2022 Amendment

Background:

The CDBG Five Year Consolidated Plan and subsequent Annual Action Plans provide the framework for funding priority projects. However, a change in funding for a project that constitutes twenty-percent (20%) or more requires a substantial amendment. To provide this funding to the community in a timely manner, the City will be amending the 2022 Annual Action Plan in order to meet the annual timeliness test.

In order to meet timelines, the City will be shifting funds from our Parks, Playgrounds, and Public Facilities line to our Sidewalk budget line. The increase represents more than a 20% change butis necessary in order to meet timeliness. The Casey Park Skate Park project cannot be completed during the 2022 CDBG Program Year. This is due to a variety of reasons, including that the City is waiting for an executed NYS EPF contract, timing of a late fall/winter construction and many of the skatepark contractors are currently booked with projects for the year. OPED staff is currently planning to budget for the skate park project in the 2023 CDBG Annual Action Plan.
