#### ORDINANCE #6 OF 2023

# AMENDING THE HOUSING CODE FEE SECTION OF THE "FEES" CHAPTER OF THE AUBURN CITY CODE

**WHEREAS**, On June 3, 2004, the City of Auburn by Ordinance No. 9 of 2004 amended Chapter 164 of the Auburn City Code entitled "Fees," to include a section entitled Housing Code Fees; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Auburn approves a schedule of fees annually and publishes the same for informative purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Auburn recognizes that it is appropriate to provide direct reference to this process in the municipal code; and

**WHEREAS,** it is necessary for the purposes of efficiency, clarity and certainty that the Housing Code Chapter and the annually adopted fee schedule are in alignment; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 6 of 2023, attached hereto and incorporated herein, proposes to update Chapter 164 of the City Code to achieve such goals by adding the references to the annually adopted fee schedule and making other related revisions; and

**WHEREAS**, the passage of Ordinance No. 6 of 2023, is categorized as a Type II Action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and New York State Code, Rules, and Regulations Sections 617.5(c)(16), and, therefore, pursuant to NYCRR Section 617.3(f) a determination under SEQRA is not required; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED** that the Auburn City Council does hereby repeal the following sections of Ordinance No. 9 of 2004, "Housing Code Fees"

1. Section 164-4

and,

**BE IT FURTHER ENACTED** that the Auburn City Council does hereby adopt Ordinance No. 6 of 2023 attached and incorporated herein, which replaces the following Sections of Chapter 164 of the Auburn City Code entitled "Fees":

1. Section 164-4

and,

**BE IT FURTHER ENACTED** that the foregoing repeal and adoption shall take effect immediately.

# GRANT RESOLUTION #50 OF 2023 AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION TO USDA FOREST SERVICE INFLATION REDUCTION ACT – URBAN AND COMMUNITY FORESTRY

**WHEREAS**, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced the Inflation Reduction Act – Urban and Community Forestry Program, which would provide a multiyear program for tree planting and related activities, with a priority for projects that benefit underserved populations and areas; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Auburn would like to apply for the Urban and Community Forestry grant opportunity in the amount of up to \$1,000,000, and will not require a match since the project will be completed in underserved, eligible areas in the City; and

WHEREAS, as a requirement of this Program, the applicant must obtain the approval/endorsement of the governing body of its municipality, the Auburn City Council, in which the project will be located.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Auburn City Council does hereby authorize as follows:

- 1. That the City is authorized to submit a grant application to the Inflation Reduction Act Urban and Community Forestry Program in the grant amount of up to \$1,000,000, which will not require a match as long as the project is completed in the underserved, eligible areas in the City;
- 2. That the Mayor, or other appointed designee, is authorized to submit all documents, required for the application of the grants and, upon award notification, execute any and all grant agreements and submit any and all documentation necessary for the grants;
- 3. That the City Comptroller is authorized to receive and appropriate grant funding into the appropriate departmental accounts;
- 4. That a certified copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded with the grant application, as required; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
