### RULES OF THE ELECTRIC BOARD RELATED TO EXAMINATIONS.

#### SECTION 1: INTERVIEW PROCEDURES

- This board shall hold their meeting on the second Wednesday of the month at 5:00 p.m. in the City Hall conference room, 24 South St., Auburn, NY 13021.
- 2. Applications shall be accepted at the October and April meetings, in which time the board will interview the applicant.
- 3. Examinations shall be given in November and May.
- 4. Applicant shall be present at time of interview or forfeit the opportunity to take the next proceeding month's exam.
- 5. Applications shall be presented, in person, at the time of interview only. All applications shall be complete, notarized and accompanied by a \$250.00 non-refundable application fee in check or money order payable to the City of Auburn. Under no circumstances will an application be accepted by mail; any received will be returned to sender.

#### SECTION 2: MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXAM

- The exam will be of such character as to fairly test the knowledge and qualifications of the applicant for the trade, business or calling of electrician. Permission to take the exam shall be granted to an applicant who has proven the following to the satisfaction of the board:
  - a. S/he is a competent electrician; qualified to do wiring, contracting, construction and installation work relating to electric work.
  - b. "Master" applicants shall have a minimum total of ten (10) years' experience directly related to the electrical industry, a minimum of five (5) years working directly on the installation and maintenance of electrical systems, three of these five years shall have been on new construction\* of commercial and/or industrial installations.
  - c. "Limited" applicants shall have a minimum of five(5) years' experience directly related to the electrical industry, of which a minimum of three (3) years shall have been working directly on the installation and maintenance of electrical systems and one(1) of those three (3) years shall have been on new construction\* of residential installations.
  - d. "Appliance Installer" applicants shall have a minimum of three (3) years' experience directly related to the installation of furnaces, air conditioners and other small appliances.

#### SECTION 3: INSTRUCTIONS TO THE APPLICANT

- 1. You are required to document each year's work experience for the license category for which you are applying. Proof acceptable to the board may be W2 forms, underwriters' permits, and 1040 forms if self-employed.
- 2. Letters from employers of the union should state the type of electrical work performed and the length of each job.
- 3. One (1) year's work experience is equal to 2,000 hours.
- 4. Falsehood or fraud in the application or exam shall be cause for dismissal of the application and refusal of a certificate.

#### **SECTION 4: EXAM RESULTS**

- 1. The applicant must have a standing of at least 74 on the exam in order to be entitled to a Certificate of Competency.
- 2. The names and standing of all persons taking the exam shall be formally entered in the records of the board.
- 3. When an applicant fails to pass the required exam, s/he shall not be entitled to take another exam until the next regularly scheduled exam date.

### SECTION 5: LICENSING

- 1. After receiving a Certificate of Competency the applicant has 45 days to obtain a license.
- 2. The license will be issued in your name, is not transferrable, and shall not be used by any other party, including your employer. The only exception to this is if you are the majority shareholder of a corporation. Complete and satisfactory documentation of your corporate status including your corporation's resolution and structure would be required.
- 3. Applicant shall appear **in person** at the Code Enforcement Office and provide the following insurances and fees in order to receive a license:

Self-employed licensees with no employees, who do not carry worker's compensation and/or disability insurance, must complete a CE200 exemption form available on-line at <a href="http://www.wcb.ny.gov/">http://www.wcb.ny.gov/</a>. All other licensees must provide proof of worker's compensation and disability on the following state-mandated forms: Worker's Comp - C105.2, U26.3, or SI-12. Disability Ins. - DB120.1, DB-155. \*New construction is electrical work done in newly constructed buildings or new addition to existing buildings; it is not new electrical work in an existing building.
