



RECREATIONAL BURNING **REGULATION**

>>> Outdoor fire pits are becoming more and more popular giving rise to questions about their approved use. The following list of guidelines should be followed if you want to have a recreational fire within the **City of Auburn**.

- >>> Fires must be in an approved unit.
- >>> Spark arrestor must be present.
- >>> Minimum of 25' away from any structure.
- >>> Extinguisher with minimum 4-A rating or garden hose present.
- >>> Burning only approved materials.
- >>> Must be constantly attended until fire is extinguished

>>> The following reasons would cause your fire to become a **HAZARD** and be extinguished.

- >>> Fire too large for unit.
- >>> Too close to combustibles (roof, tree, garage, etc.)
- >>> Not burning proper material (no painted wood or pressure treated wood, etc.)
- >>> Not an approved unit.
- >>> Sparks emitting from unit.

>>> Your fire could become a **NUISANCE** and be extinguished if,

- >>> A neighbor complains of smoke affecting breathing.
- >>> A neighbor complains about odor and soiling interior of house.

QUICK TIPS

Use approved container.

Burn only approved materials.

Have extinguisher present.

Stay 25 feet away from combustibles.
