



Refuse Collection Comparisons

- Research of surrounding communities of similarly sized cities and larger villages
- Majority of communities have separated and removed refuse and recycling collection from the tax base
- Of 14 communities researched, only Auburn,
 Syracuse and Canandaigua have tax based system
- Syracuse has strict limits and offers less service than Auburn

Not Included in Service Portfolio

- Oneonta, Oswego and Batavia do not offer collection services for their residents
- All residents are on their own
