The Detective Bureau was assigned 415 new cases and closed 410 previously assigned cases during 2022. Detectives made 34 arrests during the year, which included 46 felonies, 35 misdemeanors and 2 violation charges. 31 juveniles were petitioned to Cayuga County Family Court. Detectives applied for 43 warrant applications and executed 101 search warrants during the year.

The Identification Bureau was assigned 1,044 new cases and a total of 3,013 items were received as evidence/property. Officers processed 1,252 photo memory cards and 26 background checks. Officers oversaw the state mandated reporting of 162 (average) sex offenders residing in the City of Auburn which included 1,043 sex offender contacts. Officers sent 211 items out to the crime lab for further processing.

The School Resource Officer program handled 351 incidents in and around school buildings which required intervention by school officers. The incidents included criminal cases, fighting, bullying, property checks, and other disruptive behavior, and security for sporting events. SROs arrested 3 adults and 1 juvenile during the year. The program added three Special Patrol Officers which provided more coverage to schools and also provided security to city department buildings, such as City Hall, the Equal Rights Heritage Center and the city parking garage.

The Patrol Division conducted several traffic stops throughout the year in hopes of keeping drivers, passengers, pedestrians and the general public safe, by reducing the number of collisions as well as providing education to motorists. Throughout the year, we held multiple checkpoints and increased patrols during holidays as part of several grants we received, including Buckle Up New York (\$4,350 received) and several Aggressive Driving details (\$18,850 received). These grants are awarded as part of the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee. A total of 547 Uniformed Traffic Tickers were issued during these details.

The Training and Planning Division coordinated 11,642 hours of training in various subjects throughout the year, which included field training for recruits who graduated from the Syracuse Police Academy and Mohawk Valley Police Academy. All officers in our department received training which included Firearms, Use of Force, Body-Worn Cameras, Active Shooter, Duty to Intercede, Implicit Bias, and state-mandated training.

The Finger Lakes Drug Task Force initiated 120 new cases and made 37 arrests during 2022. Officers seized 75,000 doses of blue Fentanyl pills, 2,096 grams of cocaine, 13 grams of heroin/fentanyl, 146 doses of controlled prescription medication and 1,487 grams of "Molly" during confidential drug investigations throughout the year. Narcotics officers executed 36 search warrants and seized 11 firearms. They also seized over \$55,000 and 3 vehicles.
