

- Installed concrete sidewalks, granite curbing, decorative lighting, landscape plantings, closed drainage and storm water management and traffic signal upgrades







Public Nuisance

"any building, structure, lot, site or separately identifiable portion thereof where ... activities which create an unreasonable interference with a person's lawful use and enjoyment of their own property due to excessive noise and general disturbance of the peace.

The Committee may promulgate rules and regulations to carry out and give full effect to the provisions of the Nuisance Chapter





DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

- Continued removing ash trees affected by the Emerald Ash Borer.
 - Approximately 420 ash trees have been removed.
- Community tree planting event including 60 trees.
- Used approximately 1,200 tons of asphalt with our hot box trailer to fill potholes and other problem areas of our streets.
- Provided 44 burials at Soule Cemetery.

LANDFILL

- Collected 903 tons of brush curbside and delivered 601 tons of chipped material to the compost area.

Water Treatment Plant

Wastewater Treatment Plant

Water Department

- Replaced 25 water services & repaired 32 main breaks.

The Sewer Department

- Milled, repaired, black topped 40 structures on North St & the Arterial, 65 overall.
- Flushed and cleaned out the WWTP Tank on John Walsh Blvd 10 days.
- Installed new storm laterals N Marvine Ave, these new lines will take care of icy road hazards.
- Replaced the Chapman Ave Culvert

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN



- Federal law which establishes the <u>Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund</u> (<u>CLFRF</u>) to provide direct, non-competitive federal formula grants from the US. Treasury Department (CFDA Program 21.027)
- Funding released in 2 tranches (disbursements)
 - 50% May 2021 & balance 12 months later-May 2022
- Spending Period: Beginning March 3, 2021 to December 31, 2026
