New Cases – 1 new case

- A woman in her 50's living outside the city.

Contact tracing is complete.

Mandatory Quarantine/ Isolation

35 in Mandatory Quarantine

12 in Mandatory Isolation

Hospitalized patients

Three hospitalized Cayuga County residents at this time.

Confirmed Cases – total year to date

There have been a total of 75 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Cayuga County.

Discharges- total year to date

There have been 62 individuals discharged from Mandatory Isolation.

Deaths

One death related to COVID-19 in our county.

Test Results Received –

Number of test results received since testing began in early March –2310 as of today.

- This information includes all testing of Cayuga County residents by physicians, healthcare facilities and licensed clinical laboratories.

Results pending –

As of today, we are awaiting the results of 23 tests that were performed on Cayuga County residents by the Cayuga County Health Department, physicians, health care facilities and licensed clinical laboratories.

Additional information – The map being released today May 21, 2020 is reflective of the number of cases year to date through May 20, 2020. In anticipation of good weather and the holiday weekend, people will have the urge to gather. Under the Governor’s order 202.10, it states that “non-essential gatherings of individuals of any size for any reason (e.g. parties, celebrations or other social event) are canceled or postponed at this time.”
