The Detective Bureau was assigned 40 new cases and closed 33 previously assigned cases. Detectives made 7 adult arrests, which included 16 felonies and 9 misdemeanor charges, and also executed 7 search warrants during the month. 9 juveniles were petitioned to Cayuga County Family Court on a total of 1 felony, 9 misdemeanors and 1 violation. The bureau had 94 open cases at the end of August.

The Identification Bureau was assigned 90 new cases and a total of 296 items were received as evidence/property. Officers processed 97 photo memory cards during the month. Officers oversaw the state mandated reporting of 164 sex offenders residing in the City of Auburn which included 90 sex offender contacts. Officers sent 23 items out to the crime lab for further processing.

The Training and Planning Division coordinated 1,130 hours of training during the month, which included School Resource Officer Training, Emergency Response Team Training, Legal Issues, Next of Kin Notifications, and Patrol Firearms. All department members also took part in Sexual Harassment Training.

During the month, we held our annual National Night Out Event, which brought our community, law enforcement, vendors, and partner agencies together for a night of food and fun. We also assisted Dunkin' Donut with collecting donations for the Special Olympics. We handed out coupons for a free donut and t-shirts for those who donated. We assisted with the Bike Rodeo held at Melone Village, which taught children bicycle safety and gave children the chance to ride through a safety course. We also took part in the medication drug take back event, held at the Auburn Elks Club, where unwanted or expired prescriptions and other medications were dropped off for safe disposal or destruction. Finally, our latest promotions were recognized at the weekly City Council meeting on August 10th.
